Project news: Tampa Airport Interchanges (State Road 60)

Detours on State Road 60 near TPA

TAMPA -- Eastbound or westbound State Road 60/Memorial Highway may be closed near the Spruce Street/ Tampa International Airport (TPA) interchange as needed Friday through Saturday (October 16 - 24) nights. Eastbound closures will happen between 10:30 p.m. and 4:30 a.m.; westbound closures will occur between 11:30 p.m. and 4:30 a.m. Watch closely for lighted message signs alerting of the closures and to guide you to the detours.

- * DETOUR for EASTBOUND SR 60 CLOSURE: Traffic will be directed off at the Spruce Street/TPA exit, continue east on Spruce St. to Westshore Blvd., then south on Westshore Blvd. to Cypress St., northbound I-275, or Kennedy Blvd. To access southbound I-275, continue south on Westshore Blvd., then turn right onto Kennedy Blvd., continue west and use the entrance ramp on the west side of Westshore Plaza.
- * DETOUR for WESTBOUND SR 60 CLOSURE: Traffic will be directed off at the Spruce Street exit, then u-turn at O'Brien Street and use the westbound Spruce Street entrance ramp to westbound SR 60.

Eastbound and westbound Courtney Campbell to be detoured early mornings

TAMPA -- Eastbound State Road 60 traffic on the Courtney Campbell Parkway continuing east towards Spruce Street, Tampa International Airport and I-275 may be detoured from 12 a.m. to 4 a.m. Saturday through Sunday (October 17 - 25) mornings as crews do bridge work over the road. DETOUR: Traffic will be directed north on Memorial Highway to the Independence Parkway exit, north on George Road, then east and south on Memorial Highway to eastbound State Road 60.

Westbound State Road 60 / northbound Memorial Highway traffic going onto the Courtney Campbell Parkway may also be detoured these same hours and nights. DETOUR: Continue north, exit to Independence Parkway, go north on George Road, then east and south on Memorial Highway to the westbound State Road 60 exit towards Clearwater.

Lane closures on SR 60 approaching I-275

TAMPA -- One to two lanes will be closed on eastbound State Road 60 / southbound Memorial Highway from south of the Courtney Campbell Parkway to I-275 between 8:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Friday through Saturday (October 16 - 24) nights.

Westbound SR 60 exit to airport may be closed at night

TAMPA -- The westbound State Road 60/northbound Memorial Highway exit to George Bean Parkway (roadway into Tampa International Airport) may be closed between 11:30 p.m. and 4:30 a.m. Friday through Saturday (October 16 - 24) nights. DETOUR: Take the ramp split onto eastbound Spruce Street. Get into the left lane, u-turn at the traffic signal at O'Brien Street, and use the westbound Spruce Street ramp into the airport.

Night lane closures on Courtney Campbell

TAMPA -- One to two lanes may be closed on eastbound and westbound State Road 60 on the Courtney Campbell Parkway between Memorial Highway and Rocky Point Drive from 8:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (October 18 - 24) nights.

Lane closures on TPA exit road at night

TAMPA -- One to two lanes may be closed on southbound George Bean Parkway (outbound roadway from Tampa International Airport) between 8:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (October 18 - 24) nights.

Lane closures on Cypress Street

TAMPA -- One lane may be closed in each direction of Cypress Street under State Road 60 from 8:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Friday through Saturday (October 16 - 24) nights and from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Saturday through Sunday (October 17 - 25).

Project news: I-275 from Himes Avenue to the Hillsborough River

Southbound I-275 lane closures at night

TAMPA -- The left lane may be closed on southbound I-275 from west of the Hillsborough River to Himes Avenue (Exit 41C) from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Thursday (October 18 - 22) nights.

Night lane closures on southbound I-275

TAMPA -- One lane may be closed on southbound I-275 between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. Monday and Tuesday (October 19 and 20) nights at the following locations:

- * Monday night: Several locations between I-4 and the Hillsborough River.
- * Tuesday night: Over North Boulevard, Willow Avenue, and Mac Dill Avenue (between the Hillsborough River and Himes Avenue (Exit 41C).

Lane closures and very slow traffic on southbound I-275 Sunday and Monday nights

ST. PETERSBURG -- Two lanes will be closed on southbound I-275 approaching work zones from 8:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. Sunday and Monday (October 18 and 19 nights). In addition, one to two traffic paces will be used to set overhead sign structures between 11:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. these same nights. During the traffic paces, all entrance ramps within the pacing area will be closed.

During the traffic paces, all entrance ramps within the pacing area will be closed until the front of the pacing operation passes. The traffic paces will be very long -- up to 30 minutes. Motorists should be prepared for these delays and may want to choose alternate routes. Here are the work zones and the traffic pacing areas:

Sunday night, October 18: Install the structure over southbound I-275 at 22nd Avenue South (mile post 20). Pacing will begin at 54th Avenue North and proceed south. During the pacing, all entrance ramps onto southbound I-275 will be closed from 54th Avenue North (Exit 26) to 31st Street South.

Monday night, October 19: Install the structure over southbound I-275 at 30th Avenue North (mile post 24). Pacing will begin at Roosevelt Boulevard (Exit 30) and proceed south. During the pacing, all entrance ramps onto southbound I-275 will be closed between Gandy Boulevard (Exit 28) and 38th Avenue North (Exit 25).

Closures and pacing operations could take place additional nights if work is not completed. Check myTBI.com for status updates.

Project news: Northbound I-275 Connector to CR 296 / SR 686

Night lane closures on I-275 north and south of Roosevelt Boulevard

ST. PETERSBURG -- One to two lanes lane will be closed on northbound and southbound I-275 between Gandy Boulevard (Exit 28) and Ulmerton Road (Exit 31) from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Friday night (October 16) and Sunday through Friday (October 18 - 23) nights.

Day and night lane closures on Roosevelt Boulevard at I-275

ST. PETERSBURG -- One to two lanes may be closed in each direction of Roosevelt Boulevard (State Road 686) from I-275 to 28th Street North from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Friday night (October 16) and Sunday through Friday (October 18 - 23) nights, as well as from 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday (October 17) and Monday through Saturday (October 19 - 24).

Southbound I-275 exit to Roosevelt / CR 296 to be closed early mornings

ST. PETERSBURG -- Southbound I-275 Exit 30 to Roosevelt Boulevard (State Road 686) and County Road 296 (118th Avenue) will be closed between 12:01 a.m. and 5:30 a.m. Saturday morning (October 17) and Monday through Saturday (October 19 - 24) mornings. DETOURS: Use Exit 31 and take Ulmerton Road (State Road 688) west to Roosevelt Boulevard. If going to

County Road 296, go east on Roosevelt, then turn right on 28^{th} Street North and continue to County Road $296 / 118^{th}$ Avenue.

Project news: Interstate 75 Interchange at County Road 54

Night lane closures on I-75 near CR 54

WESLEY CHAPEL -- One lane will be closed on northbound and southbound I-75 from north of the rest areas to north of County Road 54 (Exit 279) between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m. Sunday through Thursday (October 18 - 22) nights.
